Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-Time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six-month period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

1. A student has the right to cancel his or her agreement for a program of instruction and receive a full refund, through the first class session, or the seventh calendar day after enrollment whichever is later. However, a student or legal guardian can cancel this enrollment agreement in writing within three (3) business days of signed the enrollment agreement regardless of whether the student has actually started training. All monies collected with the exception of \$150.00 Registration/Application fee.

2. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time and you have the right to receive a prorata refund if you have completed sixty (60) percent or less of the program. Changes to programs, i.e. drops and/or adds can only be made during the first 7 calendar days of the program.

3. Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the following address: Le Melange Academy of Hair, 931 Coombs Street, Napa, CA 94559.

4. The cancellation date will be determined by the postmark on written notification, or the date said information is delivered to the Academy in person.

5. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.

6. If the Enrollment agreement is cancelled, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received, the Academy will refund the student any money he/she paid, less a registration and application fee and less any deduction for equipment that the student has received and signed for, and any tuition used.

REMEMBER THAT YOU MUST CANCEL IN WRITING. You do not have the right to cancel by telephoning the Academy or by not coming to class.

A student may cancel their agreement with the school at any time by providing a written notice and a withdrawal may be affected by a student's lack of attendance. The school provides a pro-rated refund of non-federal student financial aid monies paid for institutional charges of the amount paid for institutional charges, less the enrollment fee and application fee, if notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first class session or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. In calculating any tuition refund due, enrollment time is defined as the time elapsed between the actual starting date and the date of the student's last date of physical and recorded attendance. The percentage of attendance will be determined by the scheduled hours attended divided by the total hours in the program.
